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Abu-Ghazaleh Launches Professional Examination System and E-evaluation Service

AMMAN – HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, founder and chairman of the International Arab Society of Certified Accountants (IASCA), announced the launch of the professional examination system and the electronic evaluation service; both developed by Talal Abu-Ghazaleh E-Solutions Department at Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global (TAG. Global).

The new system enables companies evaluate institutions to and the performance of their employees for the purposes of promotion, job transfers, and training. The electronic evaluation examines employees' system professional knowledge, analyzes the results and provides the necessary recommendations. The system also allows the concerned organizations to conduct professional exams for their staffs, in addition to university students in Arabic and English.

The new system provides the following set of features:

- Analyzing the evaluation results and determining the training needs of both departments and employees.
- Conducting recruitment exams for new employees.
- Conducting professional exams for the institution's existing employees.

Professional examination and evaluation electronic system

The Society offers an electronic assessment service to public and private sector companies and institutions. This service allows companies to evaluate the performance of their employees in order to make appropriate decisions related to promotions, job transfers, training and enhancing skills, through the use of an online assessment system which examines job related and professional knowledge of employees. The system analyzes the results and makes the necessary recommendations.

It is important to note that the International Arab Society of Certified Accountants holds all of its professional examinations using the online examination system developed by the Department for Electronic Solutions at Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global. This system was designed to be comprehensive and easy to use by students, whilst simultaneously being condensed/concise, thus reducing the amount of time, efforts and costs involved, at a time when digital transformation has become an urgent need to keep up with technological developments/advancements. The system includes a portal for sitting for exams, and another portal for correcting exam answers and electronically issuing exam results.


'Abu-Ghazaleh Knowledge Society' and the Creativity Club Society Cooperate in Training on Robotics Programming
