Lebanon Honors Talal Abu-Ghazaleh by Naming Al-Ghazieh Public School After Him

‘Abu-Ghazaleh Global’ and Lebanese University Sign Agreement to Establish the First Technological Devices Factory in Lebanon

Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global (TAG.Global) signed an agreement with the Lebanese University to establish the first-of-it's-kind factory in Lebanon for manufacturing technological devices at the University's branch in Al Fanar area. The agreement was signed in the presence of HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, founder and chairman of TAG.Global, but the signing ceremony was attended by a large number of ministers, MPs, and officials in Lebanon, including Minister of Education and Higher Education, HE Dr. Abbas Halabi, Minister of Industry, HE Mr. George Boujikian, Minister of Youth and Sports, HE Dr. George Kallass, Minister of Labor, HE Mr. Moustafa Bayram, Former Minister of Industry, HE Mr. Imad Hoballah. The press and media representatives were also there to cover the event.

The agreement, signed by the University President, Prof. Bassam Badran, and Mr. Burhan Al Ashkar, representative of HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh for Culture and Media in Lebanon, aims to manufacture, assemble and produce technological devices, such as smartphones, tablets, and laptops with the motto (Made in Lebanon); a step that would remarkably provide job and training opportunities for the Lebanese students and people.

In this regard, Minister Halabi said: “Today is considered a milestone achievement in the University’s journey to be designated as the Productive University, by establishing Talal Abu-Ghazaleh for Technology (TAGTech) factory that manufactures and produces devices under the label (Made in Lebanon), numerous job and technical training opportunities will be created for university students and others.”

For his part Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh expressed his pride in the partnership with the University, noting that it is a true partnership where responsibilities and outcomes are equally shared. He further stressed that “Through this partnership, we have successfully established the TAGTech factory in the University’s headquarters, where commitments will be put into action, not just promises.”

Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh also pointed out that the factory would create training opportunities for the University students in the field of technology industry, as it would contribute to increasing the Lebanese Gross National Product (GNP).

Minister Boujikian also affirmed that the Ministry would issue an industrial certificate under the name of the Lebanese University to support this joint project between the University and TAGTech, pointing out that establishing such a factory is the start of a promising and important sector that Lebanon needs during these challenging circumstances.

In his key remarks, University President Prof. Badran, confirmed, that the agreement will contribute to generating learning, training, and employment opportunities for its students. This will enable students to become members of its faculties and research cadres in the faculties of engineering, science, management, and the Institute of Technology. In addition, they may benefit from the emerging opportunities of manufacturing, production, development, programming, marketing, and management in the factory.





Abu-Ghazaleh Announces the Launch of the First-of-its-Kind Smart School Bag in the World

For his part, Minister Halabi praised Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh's efforts in implementing the digital transformation strategy in Lebanon. He mentioned that the Smart School Bag would effectively lessen the burden on teachers, learners and parents thanks to its technical flexibility. He further stated that the digital transformation is part of the Ministry's mission, which already signed the digital transformation agreement at the United Nations to introduce it into the Lebanese curriculum.



Meanwhile, PEDAGOGY Co-founder and General Manager, Mr. Hani Hamed, commended the role played by the Ministry in enhancing the partnership between the public and the private sectors to promote the educational process, pointing to the efforts of the Center for Educational Research and Development in coordination and cooperation with TAG.Global in developing the Smart School Bag project. For his part, Minister Sharafeddine expressed his gratitude and appreciation to Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh for his ongoing support and professional services, as well as his support of the depositors' rights and the pursuit of their just cause.

During the meeting, Mr. Boustani briefed the meeting on all international agreements, covenants, and treaties that safeguard and protect human rights in general and their application to the depositors' legal claim in particular. All such measures and principles shall be taken into account while taking the case to all relevant international organizations towards a just solution for the depositors' legitimate claim to recover their money in full.

US-China Relations: No real change

Having reached concerning levels, the saber rattling between the US and China has been a worrying development that I have addressed on many occasions before. The increasing hostility between the two, both economically and politically, has deteriorated to the point where both sides have publically warned of possible confrontation with the other.

In a positive move however, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken has met China's President Xi Jinping in Beijing on Monday 19 June 2023, in a bid to ease tensions and improve communication between the world's two largest economies. The meeting, which was not originally on Blinken's schedule and was only announced an hour before it took place was the first face to face encounter between the two leaders since Blinken took office in January 2023. It came after months of frosty relations between Washington and Beijing, marked by disputes over trade, human rights, Taiwan, Hong Kong, cybersecurity and other issues. A previous meeting was originally scheduled for February this year, but was cancelled after the US shot down a supposed Chinese spy balloon found in US airspace.

After a 35 minute meeting at the Great Hall of the People on Tiananmen Square, Blinken told reporters: "I stressed that... sustained communication at senior levels is the best way to responsibly manage differences and ensure that competition does not veer into conflict. I heard the same from my Chinese counterparts. We both agree on the need to stabilize our relationship." Blinken also said that he was "clear-eyed" about China and there were "many issues on which we profoundly - even vehemently - disagree."

For his part Xi said that the two sides had made progress and reached agreement on some specific issues, but did not elaborate on what they were, saying that China and the US should respect each other's core interests and major concerns, should avoid confrontation and conflict, and should cooperate on global challenges such as climate change, public health and economic recovery.

Both leaders agreed on the need to stabilize their relationship and to prevent competition from turning into conflict. But they also acknowledged that there were major differences on many issues.

The meeting followed a visit by Microsoft's co-founder Bill Gates to Beijing earlier in June where he met President Xi, showing some potential for cooperation between the two countries on issues such as clean energy and innovation.

Blinken's visit to China was part of his Asia tour, which also included stops in Japan, South Korea and India. He said that his trip aimed to demonstrate US commitment to its allies and partners in the region, as well as to uphold a free and open Indo-Pacific.

He also said that he had raised concerns about China's actions in the region, such as its military pressure on Taiwan, its maritime claims in the South China Sea and its crackdown on democracy in Hong Kong.

The meeting between Blinken and Xi is undoubtedly a positive sign of re-engagement and a message to their own people that they are willing to reach out to each other. The two countries will need to balance their interests and values, manage their differences and risks, and seek common ground and solutions.

It is encouraging that hostile rhetoric between the two has moved down a gear. However, the very nature of the relationship between them, each representing a major trading bloc as well as differing political interests, is set to remain fraught with challenges and uncertainties.

In my personal view, no progress, no agreement, no hopes.

HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, founder and chairman of Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global (TAG.Global), addressed the 16th International Conference for the Gifted and Talented, organized by the Arab Council for the Gifted and Talented (ACGT) at the University of Petra, as a keynote speaker, in the presence of Former Prime Minister Prof. Adnan Badran.



The Conference was held under the theme: “Gift, Talent, and Artificial Intelligence in Education: Visions for the Future,” with the participation of a group of intellectuals and high-ranking dignitaries.

In his speech, Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh highlighted the importance of keeping abreast with the technological advancement that has become today’s reality and the backbone of the future, affirming that the main source of world power today relies on ICT-based economy, rather than military capability.

He referred to some ICT corporations that have become more powerful than some countries.

Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh went on to say that creativity only requires an individual decision rather than awaiting support from others. He cited TAG.Global as an example, noting that it has become global



in various fields, due to its choice to become a creative knowledge-based organization, developing hundreds of knowledge-based inventions that it offers as a service to its clients.

For his part, Prof. Badran stressed the importance of fostering creative thinking abilities in education, stating that creative minds could be developed by adopting integrated learning methods in solving problems, fact-finding, and building skills.

Prof. Badran called for updating the education inputs that will shift it to integrated learning, as well as changing the school's image to become more appealing to students, saying: "We must focus on training teachers and developing curriculum that corresponds to the era of competitive globalization, modern and contemporary concepts, and trends in education."

In his statement, Prof. Atef Kanaan, chairman of the ACGT, said: "Encouraging and supporting talented and gifted people has become an imperative. At the same time, developing education is the only key for any society to keep pace with the progress of nations at various levels."

During the session, Prof. Rami Abdel-Rahim, president of the University of Petra, talked about the University's role in promoting talented students and creativity, pointing out that talented people have logical thinking that enables them to perceive and see some aspects that others do not.

Meanwhile, Prof. Essam Zabalawi, president of the Australian University in Kuwait, touched upon the importance of employing artificial intelligence (AI) in educational institutions. He noted that while higher education institutions in developed countries have been working to expand the use of AI, their counterparts in the Arab region are still at the stage of thinking about the possibility of employing it. During the Conference, speakers criticized the lack of inventions and intellectual production in Jordan, especially in light of the current education system that needs to be upgraded. They also stressed that the era of digitalization and artificial intelligence is based on scientific research that is not valuable unless it leads to an actual invention.

At the end of the Conference, the patron of the Conference, Dr. Badran, handed over the honorary shields and certificates to Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh, and the speakers.

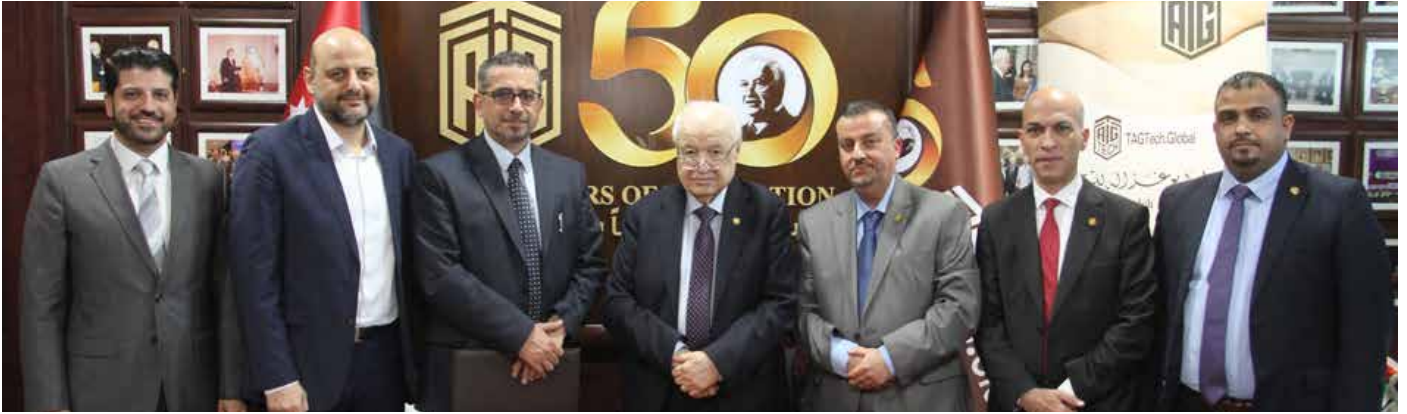

AI and Shortening Time ... China Using AI to Improve Educational Outcomes

China is emerging as one of the leading countries in adopting AI for education purposes. Chinese authorities have been using various AI technologies in classrooms that can help teachers and students in different ways, such as headbands that measure brain waves and monitor student engagement and concentration levels. These devices can help teachers determine the students' weaknesses and strengths, as well as tailor their instruction to the individual needs of each student and provide feedback on their learning progress. Other classrooms use cameras and programs that track facial expressions and analyze student behavior. These tools can help teachers assess student emotions and motivation and determine when teachers can intervene to address an issue or provide support to the student when necessary.

Some classrooms also use software that determines students' levels using programs that assign scores based on student concentration levels and performance, which can help teachers evaluate student learning outcomes and provide personalized guidance and support.

This highlights China's determination to invest in AI technologies to enhance student learning and prepare them for the highly competitive college entrance exams, for which parents and teachers are always looking for to gain a competitive edge and improve student performance.

China has proved its ability to address some of the biggest challenges in education today, such as access to good education, inclusion, and looking into issues affecting education in terms of language, in addition to personalized learning experiences through smart teaching systems rather than unified learning/educational processes.

With AI technology, we can quickly highlight how each learner's strengths and weaknesses can be identified in order to develop a tailored approach for each student.

I see that such AI tools are an essential technology that

will go a long way to democratize education in ways we could have never imagined.

However, such technology also brings challenges and risks that must be addressed. AI can exacerbate existing inequalities and biases in education through the users! Its tools may also not suit a few groups of learners.

It can also create new digital divides between countries and regions that have different levels of access to technology, infrastructure and skills.

AI also relies on large amounts of data, which raises concerns about the privacy and security of students' personal information as it could be vulnerable to hacking, manipulation or misuse by malicious actors.

There is a definite need to ensure that data collection, storage and analysis are done in a transparent, ethical and secure manner.

The introduction of this technology also requires teachers and learners to acquire new skills and competencies to be able to use it effectively. Teachers need to learn how to integrate AI into their teaching practices, as well as how to evaluate its impact on student learning.

Learners need to learn how to effectively interact with AI systems, as well as how to critically appraise their reliability, validity and limitations.

As someone that has been advocating for the benefits of AI for many years and in my capacity as a member of the UNESCO Advisory Committee for Quality and Excellence in Education, I believe that we need to embrace AI as an opportunity for innovation and improvement in education. However, we must ensure that it is developed and used in a way that respects the rights, dignity and diversity of all learners. We must develop a comprehensive vision of public policy on AI for sustainable development and work together as a global community to harness the potential of AI for education while ensuring its ethical application.

Finally, other nations would do well to follow China's lead in applying AI to education. History has shown that those willing to modernize their educational systems with new approaches, technologies and learning systems are the ones that benefit from first-mover advantage, setting up their economies to reap great rewards further down the line as their citizens become more effective knowledge workers in fields that contribute to their community's development and advancement.



Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh Patronizes Launch Ceremony of ‘Robotics Week 2023’ Activities

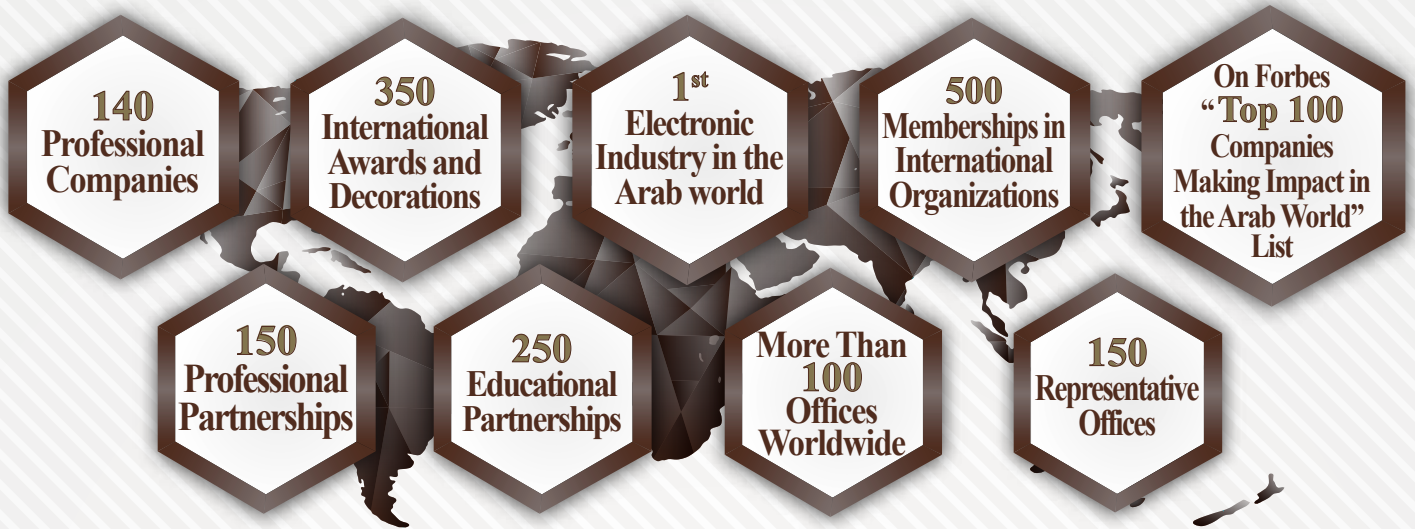
For his part, Dr. Mohamad Al-Bdour, chairman of


