ASIP Launches Famous Arab Trademarks Initiative, Establishes Association for Protecting Owners of Trademarks



This initiative comes as an implementation of the recent decisions concluded by ASIP's Board of Directors based on the suggestion of HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, ASIP's president

AMMAN -The Arab Society for Intellectual Property (ASIP) launched an exciting initiative aims at highlighting Arab trademarks worldwide.

This initiative comes as an implementation of the recent decisions concluded by ASIP's Board of Directors based on the suggestion of HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, ASIP's president.

A special committee prepared a questionnaire that was circulated to all communication channels via an

independent special website www.toparabbrands.com, ASIP's website, news websites, social networks (Facebook, Twitter, Youtube) as well as other various media, in order to reach as much public opinions as possible in the Arab countries (business sectors, chambers of commerce and industry, associations, professional unions, universities, and others).

Information will be collected and analyzed electronically to issue two lists: one includes the most famous Arab trademarks in general, and the second contains the most famous Arab trademarks by sector.

Mr. Moutasem Al-Dmour, ASIP executive director, said: "Voting for the famous

trademarks using the questionnaire will begin in mid-September until the 1st of November 2012. In addition, awards will be granted according to specific standards for those who have completed the questionnaire."

He added: "A specific minimum number of votes will be set for a trademark to be considered famous within the list, and a trademark must obtain the votes of at least five countries. The winning trademarks will be announced on the basis of the public views and as per voting electronically without any human intervention."

The questionnaire does not allow anyone to vote more than once via the same e-mail which makes it a very controllable voting process.

Meanwhile, and according to Al-Dmour, a new association for the protection of owners of famous Arab trademarks will be established.

"Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, ASIP's president, instructed during the last meeting of the Board of Directors to establish an association for the protection of owners of famous Arab trademarks. Such protection is to be achieved through developing standards for Intellectual Property valuation, particularly famous trademarks, as well as assisting owners of Arab trademarks to promote their fame internationally," he concluded.

Mr. Shaban, a member of Multistakeholder Advisory Group, worked with MAG members on finalizing the schedule of the first Arab IGF meeting including the main sessions, the speakers and the workshops. He also moderated the main session under the theme of Access and Contents.

"MAG meeting set a good example of working together with all

stakeholders, governments, international organizations, private sector and civil society in an open spirit and in a constructive manner taking into consideration the concerns of all parties," Shaban said.

AGIP was selected to join the first Arab IGF Multistakeholder Advisory Group (AMAG) according to the Secretariat's criteria mainly for having appropriate experience in the field of Internet governance and related public policy, good knowledge of the outputs of the World Summit on the Information Society Geneva 2003 and Tunis 2005, and knowledge of the global IGF process mechanisms.

Morocco Sets New Official Charges for IP Services

CASABLANCA - The Moroccan Industrial and Commercial Property Office (OMPIC) has modified its official charges related to different Intellectual Property (IP) services effective October 1st, 2012.

According to the new tariff, charges for filing patent, trademark and design will be increased. Meanwhile, lateness fees for filing of documents will be charged 50% of the global amount of official fees paid for the patent, trademark or design.

The most relevant changes are outlined as follows:

Patents:

- New service of search and opinion on patentability.
- New publication charges.
- Annuities will be paid per year instead of five years. In case of late payment of annuities, fees will be increased up to 25% with a minimum of 200 Moroccan Dirhams (MAD).
- Restoration fees will be equivalent of 100% of the annuity fees in addition to the lateness fees.
- Claims will be charged per claim instead of pages, as of the 10th claims.

Trademarks

- Filing and renewal charges will be paid per class.

Trademark Opposition:

- Charges for filing opposition, request of extension and

suspension will be increased.

Assignment/merger/change of name/withdrawal:

- Charges for change of name, address or status will be decreased.
- Charges for assignment and withdrawals will be increased.

National Gazette:

- Fees for obtaining a copy of the national gazette either for patent, trademark and design will be increased.

In this regard, the Moroccan Ministry of Industry, Commerce and New Technologies is preparing a new law which will enter into force in 2013.

Abu-Ghazaleh Intellectual Property (AGIP) will amend its schedule of charges which will be posted on the website.

Lebanon Adopts Tenth Edition of Nice Classification



BEIRUT – The Tenth Edition of the International Classification of Goods and Services for the Purposes of the Registration of Marks under the Nice Agreement (Nice Classification) has been officially adopted in Lebanon, according to the Trademark Office at the Ministry of Economy and Trade.

The Trademark Office is now ready to receive trademark applications for goods and services under the same edition of the classification.

The Nice Classification is a system of classifying goods and services for the purpose of registering trademarks. The system groups products into 45 classes and allows users seeking to trademark a good or service to choose from these classes as appropriate.

Since the system is recognized in numerous countries, this makes applying for trademarks internationally a more streamlined process, and it is specified by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).

New Trademark Official Fees in the West Bank



RAMALLAH – The Palestinian Government has adopted on September 3, 2012 a new list of official fees for trademark services in the West Bank.

In accordance with the new list, the official fees will be increased including fees for filing, publication, registration, renewal, recordal, oppositions and cancellation services.

AGIP is revising its schedule of charges accordingly and the list of its charges will be

posted soon.

Kingdom of Bahrain to Accede to Budapest Treaty



GENEVA - The Government of the Kingdom of Bahrain, on August 20, 2012, deposited its instrument of accession to the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure, done in Budapest on April 28, 1977, and amended on September 26, 1980.

According to the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), Contracting States which allow or require the deposit of microorganisms for the purposes of patent procedure shall recognize, for such purposes, the deposit of a microorganism with any international depositary authority. Such recognition shall include the recognition of the fact and date of the deposit as indicated by the international depositary authority as well as the recognition of the fact that what is furnished as a sample is a sample of the deposited microorganism.

The said Treaty will enter into force, with respect to the Kingdom of Bahrain, on November 20, 2012.

Historic Patent Reform Implemented by USPTO



WASHINGTON - The most significant reform to the US patent system in more than a century took a major step forward on September 16, 2012, as numerous provisions of the Leahy-Smith America Invents Act of 2011 went into effect, a press release by the US Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) stated. The new rules will spur innovation and economic growth by streamlining the patent application process and introducing new procedures to ensure patent quality. Seven reforms to US patent law went into effect one year after the signing of the bipartisan patent reform legislation by President Barack Obama on September 16, 2011.

Some of the new rules are as follows:

- Three new administrative trial provisions-
-inter parts review, post-grant review,

and the transitional program for covered business method patents—will offer third parties timely, cost-effective alternatives to district court litigation to challenge the patentability of an issued patent. Additional information on third party submissions can be found here.

- The supplemental examination provision allows applicants to submit additional information relevant to the patentability of an issued patent to the Office in a new procedure that may protect the patent from an inequitable conduct charge.
- The inventors oath and declaration provision that for the first time allows assignee filing of a patent application.
- The citation of prior art and written statements provision will enable the Office to treat the claims in a patent consistent with how a patent owner represents its claims to the courts or in other Office proceedings.

“These new AIA provisions now in effect give us tools to deliver cutting-edge technologies to the marketplace sooner, further reducing the backlog of patent applications, and getting high-quality patents issued faster,” said Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and Director of the USPTO David Kappos. “And that will translate into opportunity, growth, and jobs for large and small innovators across America.”

At 12:01 a.m. on Sunday, September 16,

members of the Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB) stayed open for 24 straight hours, accepting petitions requesting a variety of legal reviews. With the new rules in effect, the PTAB came into being, having been reconstituted by the AIA from the previous review board, the Board of Patent Appeals and Interferences.

The USPTO has also created new means of contact for the public to access assistance or information about the new AIA provisions: via 1-855-HELP-AIA or HELPAIA@uspto.gov.

A number of AIA provisions have already begun the implementation process, adjustments that enabled the USPTO to immediately hire new examiners, institute new patent acceleration tools, and aggressively modernize its IT infrastructure. The AIA also instructed the USPTO to open new satellite offices, and the USPTO is moving forward on opening offices in Dallas-Fort Worth, Denver, and Silicon Valley. The USPTO opened a Detroit satellite office in July.

Other provisions of the AIA will go into effect on March 16, 2013, including the shift to a first-inventor-to-file system harmonizing the U.S. system with most industrialized nations. A Notice of Proposed Rulemaking has been published proposing the new rules and the final rule for the new Derivation Proceeding to ensure that the first inventor to file obtains the patent has already been published.
