Different discussions will be stimulated during e-AGE to drive outcomes and concrete results on practical steps towards developing a regional e-Infrastructure.

Authors are invited to submit full papers reporting on their original and unpublished

research in e-Infrastructures and computational and data-intensive sciences. All papers will be peer-reviewed for relevance, quality and originality of research.

Posters are also welcomed, featuring a poster at e-AGE will serve as an excellent advertisement for your work, and can act as a great conversation starter with e-AGE participants.

- Internet technologies and trends, Internet of Things, Security, SDN and AAI.

In a bid to speed up the registration process and verification of participants at UbuntuNet-Connect 2019, organisers of the conference are calling on all prospective participants to pay their registration fee before travelling to Antananarivo.

Participants are being asked to register early and pay their registration fee via bank transfer as there is no planned payment of registration fee onsite in Antananarivo.

Prospective participants are being encouraged to benefit from the early bird registration, which closes on 18th October 2019.

International early bird registrants are required to pay a registration Fee of \$200 while the early bird registration fee for local participants is \$100. Participants that will



register after the 18th October will pay \$250 if they are international and \$150 if local.

International Conference Seeking Solutions to Africa's Challenges Held in Nairobi



Represented by its Executive Director Yousef Torman, the Arab States Research and Education Network (ASREN) participated in the RIC2019 Conference and the Fourth AfriGEO Symposium held in Nairobi during 12-16 August 2019. The Conference and the Symposium were organized by the Regional Center for Mapping of Resources for Development (RCMRD). RCMRD was established as an inter-governmental organization and currently has 20 Contracting Member States in the Eastern and Southern Africa Regions; Botswana, Burundi, Comoros, Eswatini, Ethiopia, Kenya, Lesotho, Malawi, Mauritius, Namibia, Rwanda, Seychelles, Somali, South Africa, South Sudan, Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The objective of this conference is to spur exchange of ideas on fast tracking application of earth observation and geo-spatial technologies in the development of decision-making. The theme for this year's conference was "Earth Observation for Evidence-Based Decision Making"

During the 4 days conference attended by 450 participants and 65 speakers, all discussed the use of space technology to tackle climate change and other weather-related disasters on the continent. They also discussed formulating ideas toward the utilization of earth observation and geospatial technology in

development and decision-making with focus on agriculture and food security, weather and climate, water and water-related disasters, land use, administration and management, and the creation of innovation hubs.

ASREN Director made a presentation and participated in a panel discussion with focus on the importance of research and education networks in supporting the earth observation communities. He also emphasized on the opportunity provided by the AfricaConenct2 and AfricaConenct3 Projects as an opportunity for these communities to build on through providing high-speed and high quality network access and R&E services.
